National Nurses United Can Call for a Strike?

If a strike happens, all associates in the bargaining unit could be pressured to walk out on their patients and walk a picket line. The union would have to give a 10-day notice to the hospital.

- Because patient care is a top priority, UMC may hire temporary replacements and can lock out nurses for a period of time.
- If the strike lasts a long time, your medical benefits could be impacted and may cost you more.
- You may not be able to use your PTO while on strike.
- In most cases, nurses who are on strike aren't entitled to unemployment benefits and food stamps, in most cases.
- In the past decade, NNU and its affiliates have struck more than 80 times.
